We hope you are doing well as we have progressed into 2021! As spring brings about a sense of rebirth and restoration, we are moving forward with our own feelings of growth and improvement. Many hurdles have been cleared over the past 15 months thanks to your support! Our mission remains steady and loyal this spring: alleviating homelessness and despair by providing **Housing**, **Help and Hope** to homeless veterans and men in need. As things begin to normalize in our community, we are confident in our abilities to help men secure employment and permanent, sustainable housing, and there are several new partnerships and programs that we are pleased to share with you.

We are excited to announce that we have begun to partner with local churches to provide **services of Holy Communion** to the men we serve. Rev. Jed Hanes, Matthew 25's Director of Operations, is a provisional deacon seeking ordination in the United Methodist Church. Jed will be leading this fruitfulness project as a part of his ordination process and is seeking to partner with various faith leaders to reconnect M25 residents with the church. Our first Communion took place on Monday, April 26.

The **Tennessee State Wesley Foundation** recently organized a drive to collect essential items for the men we serve. These kits included basic toiletries, cleaning and sanitation products, devotional books, and original pieces of inspirational artwork that are now hanging on residents' walls! TSU's Wesley leader, Rev. Michelle Morton, has also offered to regularly participate in our services of Holy Communion. We are so thankful for this partnership in ministry and look forward to working more with them in the future!

Harpeth Hall School has been a steadfast supporter of Matthew 25 over the years, and they are continuing that tradition this spring. On a weekly basis, HHS girls have been providing nutritious (and tasty) snacks and notes of encouragement to our men who are working hard to transform their lives. We are hopeful that we can soon get back to their tradition of coming on site to share a meal with our residents!

The Big Payback occurred on May 5th, and Matthew 25 raised \$11,055! The Big Payback is a community wide, online day of giving hosted by the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee. We set an initial goal of \$5,000, and then an updated goal of \$10,000. Our supporters came through in a huge way, and these funds will help improve the technology provided for the men in our programs!

While it has been a difficult past year for everyone, our team is more confident and committed than ever to continue providing Christ-centered care to men in need. With the continued support of our community, we will come out on the other side of the pandemic stronger than before! Any way you can assist us today will improve our ability to empower veterans and homeless men to recapture independence and fulfillment in their lives. As always, we are honored to serve these men every day!

Why Recurring?


